This could include writing up project evaluations, formulating lessons learned from a particular approach, documenting the mental health and psychosocial wellbeing of a particular population group – and making this knowledge available to others who work in humanitarian settings elsewhere in the world.

This call for papers has no specific deadline or special subject focus. We simply want to let you know that we are open to new submissions. We have two issues for publication in 2023 – the first in April and the second in October so the sooner you get an article to us, the sooner we can consider it and get it underway.
